We invited members of the WRM's Advisory Committee to share short reflections on this extraordinary situation. We thank them for their contributions.

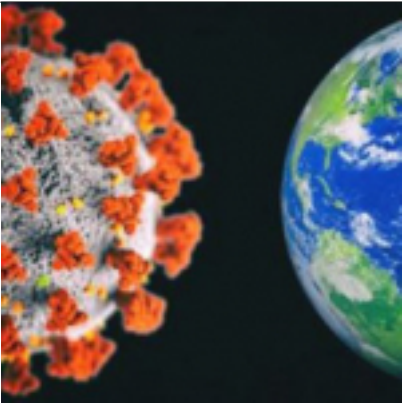

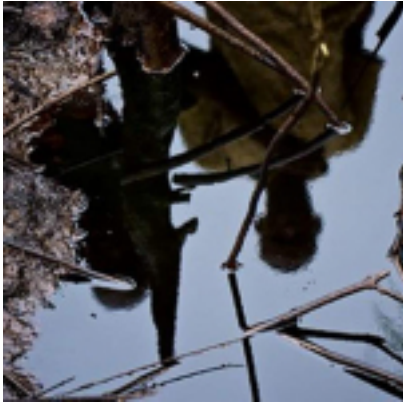
